
What Is Gum Recession?

Gum recession refers to the loss of gum tissue along the gum line. When gum recession occurs, the root structure of the tooth becomes exposed. This means that tooth decay and other problems can affect the teeth along the gum line and beneath it. Since healthy gums are essential for healthy teeth, getting gum recession treated is extremely important.

Why Do Gums Recede?

Most gum recession results from:

- Periodontal diseases
- Aggressive tooth brushing
- Insufficient dental care
- Hormonal changes
- Tobacco products
- Grinding and clenching teeth
- Crooked teeth or a misaligned bite
- Body piercing of the lip or tongue
- The natural aging process
- After orthodontics / Invisalign



The Pinhole Surgical Technique

- Are you or someone you know suffering from unsightly gum recession?
- Do your teeth appear overly long, making you appear older than you are?
- Do you hesitate to have your gum recession treated because you are fearful of traditional gum surgery?

If the answer is “yes” to any of these questions, you may be a candidate for a remarkable new gum recession treatment known as **Chao Pinhole Gum Rejuvenation**.

With this technique, there is usually no cutting, no incisions or sutures and little to no downtime. During the procedure, the doctor makes a small hole in the patient’s existing gum tissue. Through this pinhole, special instruments are used to gently loosen the gum tissue. The instruments then help to expand and move the gum line to cover the exposed root structure.



Benefits of The Pinhole Procedure

- 1** The Pinhole Procedure can correct gum recession in as little as one treatment session.
- 2** There is minimal discomfort and swelling in most cases because no scalpel is used, minimal sutures are needed, and no grafting is required.
- 3** A much gentler procedure because it avoids a painful wound on the roof of the mouth.
- 4** The procedure provides great long-term results according to the International Journal of Periodontology & Restorative Dentistry (October 2012).
- 5** Most pinholes can heal in 24 hours.
- 6** Tooth loss can be prevented.
- 7** Treatment sessions can be completed in as little as 1-2 hours.
- 8** The procedure can result in a more youthful and attractive appearance.
- 9** Patients often say they feel happier without the worry of showing receded gums.
- 10** Most patients are back to normal light activities within 24-48 hours of having the procedure.


